Would like + to + infinitive

- say things people want to do
- invitation

Negative	Pronoun + would not (wouldn't) + like + to +	He wouldn't like to go to the cinema
	verb (infinitive)	
Question	Would + pronoun + like + to + verb (infinitive)	Would you like to go to the cinema?

Would like + noun

- express preferences
- ask for things politely

Affirmative	Pronoun + would + like + noun)	He would like a dog.
		He'd like a dog.
Negative	Pronoun + would not (wouldn't) + like + noun	He wouldn't like a dog.
Question	Would + pronoun + like + noun	Would you like a dog?

2. Comparatives : "... plus ... que..."

Using than: adjective + than + ...

Short adjectives (small)	+ er	Small → smaller
		He's smaller than me.
Short adjectives that end in -e	+ r	Nice \rightarrow nicer
(nice)		She's nicer than her.
Short adjectives that end in vowel	Double + er	Big → bigger
+ consonant		A dog is bigger than a mouse.
Adjectives that end in -y	$Y \rightarrow ier$	Heavy → heavier
		My bag is heavier than yours.

Using more: more + adjective + than +

Long adjective with more than 2	More + Adj	Beautiful → more beautiful
syllables		My hairs are more beautiful than
		hers.

Irregular adjectives : adjective + than + ...

Irregular adjectives	Good → better
	Bad \rightarrow worst
