

## Grammar – unit 6

### 1. Would like : j'aimerais

#### Would like + to + infinitive

- say things people want to do
- invitation

<b>Affirmative</b>	Pronoun + would + like + to + verb (infinitive)	He would like to go to the cinema. He'd like to go to the cinema.
<b>Negative</b>	Pronoun + would not (wouldn't) + like + to + verb (infinitive)	He wouldn't like to go to the cinema
<b>Question</b>	Would + pronoun + like + to + verb (infinitive)	Would you like to go to the cinema?

#### Would like + noun

- express preferences
- ask for things politely

<b>Affirmative</b>	Pronoun + would + like + noun)	He would like a dog. He'd like a dog.
<b>Negative</b>	Pronoun + would not (wouldn't) + like + noun	He wouldn't like a dog.
<b>Question</b>	Would + pronoun + like + noun	Would you like a dog?

2. Comparatives : "... plus ... que..."

**Using than:** adjective + than + ...

<b>Short adjectives (small ...)</b>	+ er	Small → smaller He's <b>smaller than</b> me.
<b>Short adjectives that end in -e (nice...)</b>	+ r	Nice → nicer She's <b>nicer than</b> her.
<b>Short adjectives that end in vowel + consonant</b>	Double + er	Big → bigger A dog is <b>bigger than</b> a mouse.
<b>Adjectives that end in -y</b>	Y → ier	Heavy → heavier My bag is <b>heavier than</b> yours.

**Using more:** more + adjective + than + ....

<b>Long adjective with more than 2 syllables</b>	More + Adj	Beautiful → more beautiful My hairs are <b>more beautiful</b> than hers.
--	------------	---

**Irregular adjectives** : adjective + than + ...

<b>Irregular adjectives</b>	Good → better Bad → worst In basketball, my brother is <b>better than</b> me.
